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REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING-MAY 2, 2013

Supervisor Johnson called the Regular Town Board meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Supervisor Johnson led the board and the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Roll Call

Roll Call by the Town Clerk showed all board members present.

Arthur Johnson-Supervisor John Lant-Councilman Robert Pulsifer-Councilman Deputy Supervisor Rice Steve Streicher-Councilman

Also present were Town Comptroller Jeffrey Reale, Town Attorney Richard DeVall and Director of Planning and Engineering, Ryan Riper.

Public Comment Session

Supervisor Johnson asked if anyone signed up for public comment.

Jim Zack said he presented a before and after simulated view of the Gordon Residential Development Company's proposed mixed use building at the last planning board meeting. He said he has two concerns on the project. Nowhere in the Hamlet zone is there a building that has this appearance. The Comprehensive Plan states that no new buildings will be erected that don't have a consistent appearance with other buildings in the Hamlet zone. The traffic on Route 9 is the other concern. At 7:30 in the morning at the Maple Middle School entrance and Lake Elizabeth Plaza you will see all sorts of Wild West traffic negotiations. The State Patrol could make a small fortune if they would just enforce the laws on the books. New projects should not be considered on their own merit but on a total cumulative impact on other parts of the city. The projects are viewed as isolated and are reduced down to "does this project meet the requirements, as stated". The traffic should be considered as a cumulative affect and not as an individual project.

<u>Rebuilding Together-Saratoga County</u> Michelle Larkin

Michelle Larkin, Executive Director for Rebuilding Together-Saratoga County, said the organization is a non-profit that she founded 10 years ago. In 2003 there were 6 projects with 100 volunteers. Last year there were 82 projects with 792 volunteers. The non-profit organization brings together volunteers and sponsors who invest in the community. They work on projects that help Saratoga County homeowners that are elderly, disabled, low-income or veterans. The work is done for free. Spring work days are currently ongoing and the third big weekend is coming up. There will be 10 projects being done throughout the county and the issues being worked on are warm, safe and dry. The goal is to help people stay in their homes. Habitat for Humanity is for building new homes. Rebuilding Together-Saratoga County is working to keep people in their homes.

The volunteers put in almost 5,000 hours of free labor last year. The organization is a resource for the town to recommend to people, you might know someone who may want to volunteer or you might know about some free money that is available. The money comes from sponsors and grants.

A house on Jones Road was just completed. The owner was homeless a year ago. She has a son that is ill. She purchased a mobile home and all of the floors and bathroom were replaced. Last week an 89 year old woman and another 90 year old were helped. **Supervisor Johnson** said the new office for Rebuilding Together-Saratoga County is in the D.A. Collins complex on Ballard Road. **Ms. Larkin** said D.A Collins is very supportive of the organization. **Supervisor Johnson** said he saw a project being done on Gordon Lane last year and is was truly amazing to see the number of volunteers and the extent of the work. It is greatly appreciated. Deputy Supervisor Rice said the Wilton Rotary and Wilton Kiwanis are going to do a joint project with Rebuilding Together-Saratoga County this fall and he said he is looking forward to it.
